Entering Grades 7 & 8

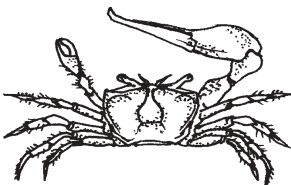

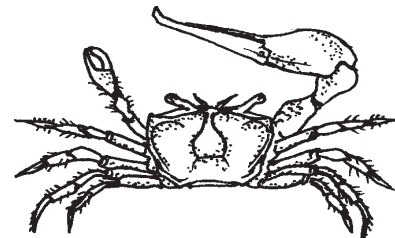
Time 8:45 – 2:00PM Mon -Wed, overnight Thurs 1:00 PM– Noon Friday
