





- Ensure a sustainable Cape region both economically AND environmentally









DATA COLLECTIONS


- Determination of 55 "Blue" Economy industry codes (Federal and Local)

- Covers 77 distinct zip codes in the Cape Cod Region
- Start of an Outreach Database
- Need to add in non-business organizations and partners




RESULTS

INPUT


- 84 Input Threads at the 9 sessions
